#### 2 year progress check - guide for parents

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS, 2012) is a legal framework for all children from the ages of birth to 5 (starting full time school in reception class). We are required by the EYFS to provide you with a written record of your child's learning and development at around the age of 2 - 3 years. The progress check should ideally be timed to coincide with your child's 2 year Health Visitor check and we will give you a copy of your child's Progress Check in time to share it with your Health Visitor.

We will ask you questions about your child's learning and development at home and we will use information from our observations of your child's play while they are here when writing the Progress Check.

Your child's Progress Check will focus on the 3 Prime Areas of Learning - communication and language, physical development and personal, social and emotional development because these are recognised as the most important for your child's life-long learning.

In your child's Progress Check, we will talk about how your child is getting on - if they are making good progress or if they need a little extra support. To make these judgements we will use the Early Years Outcomes guidance as required by Ofsted. You can find out more about how we use the Early Years Outcomes in your child's Learning Journey file which is available for you to see at any mutually convenient time.
