Safeguarding file

A lot of childminders are being advised by their Local Authorities and LSCBs to put together a safeguarding evidence file for parents and Ofsted. It is **not** a requirement to have a safeguarding evidence file – you might keep the information in other files and folders and you don't need to move everything around if it is immediately accessible and makes sense to you.

A safeguarding file might contain -

- Information sheet from your LSCB
- Your safeguarding and child protection policy and procedures
- Safeguarding procedures (often called a 'model' procedure) from your Local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB) and any additional information they give you such as referral details
- Document retention information so parents know exactly what information you keep about their child and why

- Safeguarding training certificates for any update / refresher courses you have attended / taken online
 Note while these are good practice they do not replace the 'official' training course which must be LA approved
- Further policies and procedures relating to safeguarding such as
 - o Complaints
 - Mobile phone and digital camera
 - o Risk assessment
 - o Lost / missing child
 - Failure to collect
- Copies of DBS records for those over 16 living on the premises
- Copies of your Ofsted registration certificate
- Document about domestic abuse and where to get help
- Your record forms for
 - o Accident, injury and first aid including information about reporting accidents to Ofsted and RIDDOR
 - Illness records and advice for parents
 - Guidance on infection control in childcare settings from HPA –

 - Physical intervention
 - o Incident reporting
